



Red House White

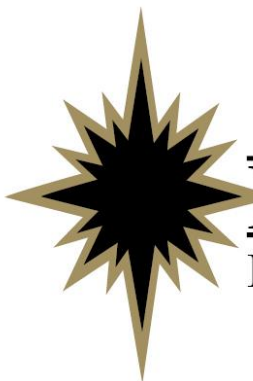
